Second Year Transformational Experience Program (STEP)

STEP is designed to focus on student success and development and will allow students the opportunity to engage in activities that cater to their individual interests and needs.

Through interaction with faculty, students will be able to develop tools for life and build essential network connections.

By fulfilling the program requirements, students will be eligible to receive a fellowship of up to \$2,000 to use towards a STEP Signature Project they might otherwise not be able to do.

Participants engage with faculty outside of the classroom in one-on-one meetings as well as in group settings. STEP faculty mentors help students explore unique, educational, and enriching experiences.
